Northern Italy (Trentino Alto-Adige)

Trentino-Alto Adige is the northernmost Italian region, comprising two areas with very different personalities: the Germanic Alto Adige or Südtirol, which borders and once belonged to Austria, and right below it the more Italian but still very Alpine Trentino. The region's capital and largest city is Trento, followed closely by the Südtirol provincial capital, Bozen (Bolzano). The breathtaking valley of the Adige River is renowned in the wine world for varietally labeled cool-climate wines, mainly white. It has no DOCGs, nine DOCs, and four IGPs. In 2016, Trentino-Alto Adige produced 1.1 million hectoliters (12.7 million cases) of wine, more than 70% of it white and almost 90% at the DOP level, the highest percentage of any region. The region's primary grape varieties are Chardonnay (22%), Pinot Grigio (19%), and Schiava (9%).

Northern Italy (Friuli-Venezia-Giulia)

Friuli-Venezia Giulia lies in extreme northeastern Italy, with Slovenia bordering it on the east and Austria on the north. Its capital and largest city is Trieste. In the wine world, Friuli-Venezia Giulia is best known for white wines made from Pinot Grigio and Friulano and sparkling wines made from Glera. It has 4 DOCGs, 12 DOCs, and 3 IGPs. In 2016, Friuli-Venezia Giulia produced 1.9 million hl (20.6 million cases) of wine, 77% of it white—tied with Veneto for the highest proportion of white wine of any region. The region's primary grape varieties are Pinot Grigio (26%), Merlot (15%), and Friulano (9%).

Northern Italy (Veneto)

Veneto is located in northeastern Italy, at the top of the Adriatic Sea. Its capital and largest city is Venice (Venezia), although Verona is nearly as large. Tourists come to Veneto primarily to visit the fabled city of Venice and Romeo and Juliet's balcony in Verona, but the region has a wealth of other gems as well, including Padua (Padova), Vicenza, the Dolomite Alps, and Lake Garda. In the wine world, Veneto is best known for red Valpolicella (including Amarone), white Soave, and sparkling Prosecco. It has the second most DOCGs (14), along with 29 DOCs and 10 IGP. Veneto is the most prolific Italian wine region, producing 10.1 million hl (113 million cases) of wine in 2016, enough to rank eighth in the world if Veneto were listed separately. More than three quarters of its production is white wine—thanks mainly to Prosecco—with 57% at the DOP level. The region's primary grape varieties are Glera (24%), Garganega (14%), Merlot (12%), Corvina (10%), and Pinot Grigio (9%).

Northern Italy (Lombardia)

Lombardia (Lombardy) is located in the middle of Italy's northern tier, stretching south from the Swiss border to the top of the peninsula. Its capital and largest city is Milan (Milano), the country's second most populous city and one of the wealthiest. Tourists know Lombardia for Milan itself—Malpensa airport, La Scala, the duomo—as well as stunning Lake Como. In the wine world, Lombardia is probably best known for the classic-method sparkling wines of Franciacorta. The region has 5 DOCGs, 21 DOCs, and 15 IGPs. In 2016, Lombardia produced 1.4 million hl (15.8 million cases) of wine. The region's primary grape varieties are Croatina (17%), Pinot Nero (14%), Chardonnay (13%), and Barbera (12%).

Northern Italy (Piemonte)

Piemonte (Piedmont) occupies most of northwestern Italy, bordering Switzerland in the north and France in the west and almost reaching the Mediterranean coast. Its capital and largest city is Turin (Torino). Piemonte does not have the tourist draws that some other Italian regions do, but it is renowned for its bucolic scenery and fine dining. In the wine world, Piemonte is best known for the twin titans of Barolo and Barbaresco, along with other popular red wines made from Barbera and Dolcetto, the white Gavi, and sparkling Asti. It has more DOCGs (17) and DOCs (42) than any other region, but no IGPs. In 2016, Piemonte produced 2.5 million hl (28.3 million cases) of wine, the majority of it (55%) red and 83% at the DOP level. The region's primary grape varieties are Barbera (31%), Moscato (22%), Dolcetto (13%), and Nebbiolo (10%).

Northern Italy (Toscana)

Toscana (Tuscany) is located at the top of the Italian peninsula on the west coast. To many people worldwide, Toscana is the quintessential Italy, and tourists flock here in droves for the majestic city of Florence (Firenze), the hill towns, the rustic yet regal villas in the countryside, and great food. In the wine world, Toscana is best known for red wines made from Sangiovese, especially Brunello di Montalcino and Chianti. It has 11 DOCGs and the second most DOCs of any Italian region (after Piemonte), with 6 IGPs. In 2016, Toscana produced 2.7 million hl (30.4 million cases) of wine, more than 85% of it red—the highest proportion of any region—and almost two thirds at the DOP level. The region’s dominant grape variety is Sangiovese (66%).

Central Italy (Umbria and Abruzzo)

Umbria, in central Italy, is a region of lush rolling hills, hilltop villages and iconic, historic towns (exemplified by Orvieto and Assisi). Its annual wine production of around one million hL (26 million gallons) is less than one third that of neighboring Tuscany, and makes it the country's fourth-smallest wine-producing region by volume. Located at the very heart of the Italian Peninsula, it is hemmed in by its neighbors Tuscany, Marche and Lazio, and is in fact the only Italian region with neither a coastline nor an international border. The native grape Sagrantino has gained prominence in the Montefalco area, creating wines of great depth and power, so it was no surprise when Montefalco Sagrantino received DOCG classification in 1992.

Abruzzo (Abruzzi) is an Italian wine region located in the mountainous central Italian region of Abruzzo along the Adriatic Sea. It is bordered by the Molise wine region to the south, Marche to the north and Lazio to the west. Abruzzo's rugged terrain, 65% of which is mountainous, help to isolate the region from the winemaking influence of the ancient Romans and Etruscans in Tuscany but the area has had a long history of wine production. The most notable wine of the region is Montepulciano d'Abruzzo produced with the Montepulciano grape that is distinct from the Sangiovese grape behind the Tuscan wine Vino Nobile di Montepulciano.

Southern Italy (Campania)

Campania is located in the southern part of the Italian peninsula, facing the Tyrrhenian Sea, in what might be called the shin of the peninsula's boot. Its capital and largest city is Naples (Napoli). Tourists know Campania for the city of Naples, the ruins of Pompeii, the isle of Capri, and the beautiful Amalfi Coast. In the wine world, Campania is best known for red wines made from Aglianico such as Taurasi, and for white wines made from Falanghina, Fiano, and Greco. It has 4 DOCGs, 15 DOCs, and 10 IGPs. In 2016, Campania produced 1.3 million hl (14.3 million cases) of wine, mostly table wine with only 19% of it at the DOP level. The region's primary grape variety is Aglianico (34%).

Southern Italy (Puglia)

Puglia (Apulia) forms the heel of the Italian peninsula's boot, running up the Adriatic coast to the boot's "spur." Its capital and largest city is Bari. As one of the least mountainous of Italy's regions, located in the sun-baked south, Puglia is a major agricultural area, for grapes and wine as for other products. In the wine world, Puglia is still not well known, but as quality continually improves, its wines are attracting great interest. It has 4 DOCGs, 28 DOCs, and 6 IGPs. In 2016, Puglia produced a bumper crop of 8.8 million hl (97.7 million cases) of wine, a big increase over 2015's record harvest, keeping it firmly in second place among the regions in production (after Veneto). Its DOP production is just 9% of the total, with another 20% at the IGP level. The region's primary grape varieties are Sangiovese (15%), Primitivo (14%), Negroamaro (14%), and Trebbiano (13%).

Italy Islands (Sicilia and Sardegna)

Sicilia (Sicily) is an island region—the largest island in the Mediterranean—which almost touches the Italian peninsula's toe (Calabria). Its capital and largest city is Palermo. Tourists know Sicilia for the beaches and Greek ruins of the south and east coasts, and its cuisine is world famous. In the wine world, Sicilia was once best known for the dessert wine Marsala, although today it is more prominent for the dry wines of Etna, as well as its large volume of everyday drinking red and white wines. It has 1 DOCG, 23 DOCs, and 7 IGPs. In 2016, Sicilia produced 5.3 million hl (59 million cases) of wine. The wine is still mostly IGP, but it has seen a strong surge at the DOP level, now up to a quarter of production. The region's primary grape varieties are Catarratto (34%) and Calabrese or Nero d'Avola (16%).

Sardegna (Sardinia) is an island region located west of the Italian peninsula across the Tyrrhenian Sea from Lazio and just south of the French island of Corsica. Its capital and largest city is Cagliari in the south. Tourists know Sardegna best for the trendy beaches of the Costa Smeralda on the northeast tip. In the wine world, Sardegna is best known for red wines made from Cannonau and white wines made from Vermentino. It has 1 DOCG, 17 DOCs, and 15 IGPs. In 2016, Sardegna produced just over 800,000 hl (8.9 million cases) of wine, with more than two thirds of it at the DOP level and more red than white. The region's primary grape varieties are Cannonau (35%) and Vermentino (28%).

France - CHAMPAGNE -

Champagne is a sparkling wine made in Northern France. The region's cold climate places it on the borderline of viticultural possibility. This extreme climate forces the Champenoise to push the envelope of winemaking. Technological innovations have allowed the Champenoise to create exquisite sparkling wine from the grapes planted in the region's chalky soils. The result of this history of innovation is known as "Méthode Champenoise". In this process, the tart and acidic wine produced by grapes in Champagne experiences a second fermentation in the bottle. The wine that emerges from this complex process has a luxurious mousse of delicate bubbles; smelling of brioche, toffee, and chalk. Champagne is the perfect aperitif. Furthermore, we encourage you to continue drinking it with dinner, where it will compliment a wide array of dishes.

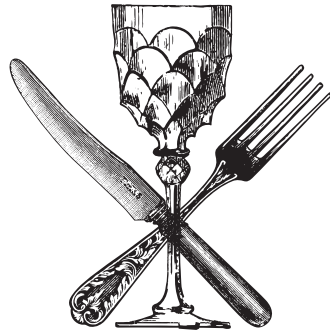
